



Founded in 2006 by its two partners Selva Gürdoğan and Gregers Tang Thomsen who met at Rem Koolhaas' studio Office for Metropolitan Architecture (OMA) in 2003, where they worked until establishing Superpool. During 2012 Superpool was invited to participate in the Audi Urban Future Award (2012), to research mobility in Istanbul in 2030. Superpool took part in the creation of the book Mapping Istanbul, a snapshot of Istanbul in 2009, positioning the city within the global context of worldwide global cities, as well as its relation with the the region, the country and Istanbul within itself.
